RESEARCH ETHICS AND INTEGRITY REGULATIONS

**Approved by the General Assembly of the Department of Philology
In compliance with Law 4957/2022 and the Code of Ethics and Good
Practice of the University of Ioannina
(Government Gazette, Issue B, No. 4647 / 08.08.2024)**

Article 1 – Purpose and Scope

In accordance with Law 4957/2022, the **Research Ethics and Integrity Committees (R.E.I.C.)** are established to ensure, at an ethical and deontological level, the reliability and integrity of research projects conducted within Higher Education Institutions and research organizations in Greece.

The Committees are responsible for verifying that research is conducted with respect for **humanitarian values, human dignity, privacy, and the protection of personal data**, as well as for the **preservation of the natural and cultural environment**.

They also ensure adherence to the **universally accepted principles of research integrity** and the criteria of **sound scientific and academic practice**.

Article 2 – Legal and Institutional Framework

At the University of Ioannina, both **Undergraduate and Postgraduate Programs** are encouraged to adopt the legal framework and the **Regulation on the Principles and Functioning of the Research Ethics and Integrity Committee (R.E.I.C.)** of the University of Ioannina.

Article 3 – Adoption by the Postgraduate Program

The **Postgraduate Program “Ancient Texts and Modern Readings”** of the **Department of Philology, University of Ioannina**, formally adopts and implements:

1. The *Regulation on the Principles and Functioning of the R.E.I.C.* of the University of Ioannina, and
2. The *Code of Ethics and Good Practice* of the University of Ioannina (Government Gazette, Issue B, No. 4647 / 08.08.2024).

The Program fully adheres to the **principles, guidelines, and procedures** set out in the Code, ensuring the observance of **ethical standards, academic integrity, and responsible research conduct**.

Non-compliance may result in actions or sanctions in accordance with the relevant provisions of the **University of Ioannina’s internal regulations and Greek legislation**.

This document forms an integral part of the internal regulations of the Postgraduate Program “Ancient Texts and Modern Readings” and is subject to periodic review by the Department of Philology in alignment with national and institutional policy updates.
